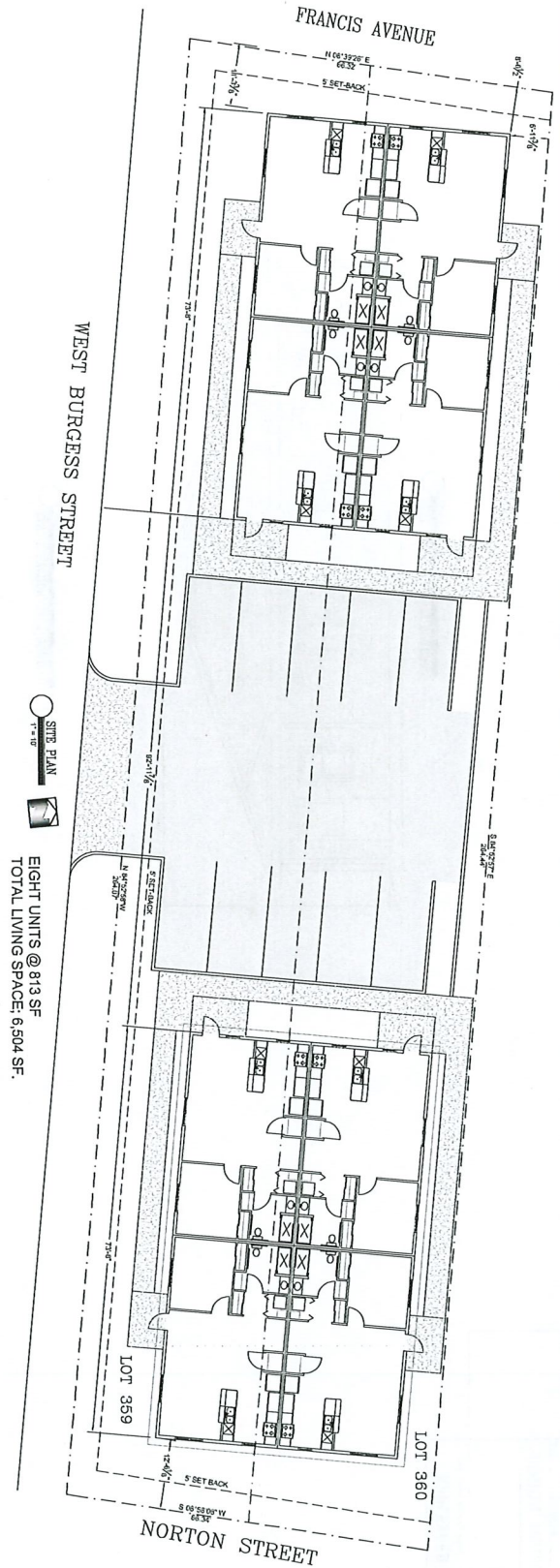

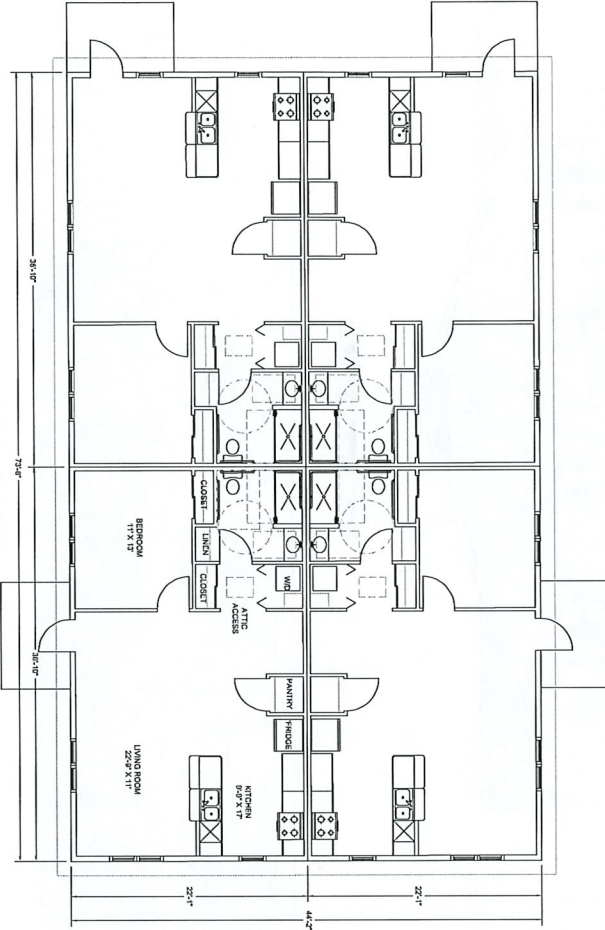

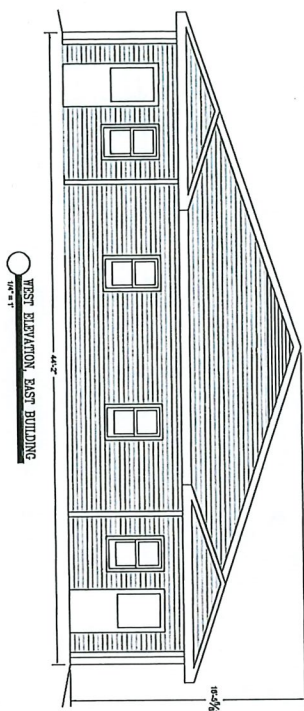

301 and 303 N Norton Rezoning Application

AAA5 Project

A statement of the reason for the proposed amendment:

The requested amendment of the zoning map to change the parcels located at 301 & 303 N. Norton Street from R1 to PCDD (Chapter 1185) is to allow the parcel to be redeveloped to allow affordable senior housing. These parcels are owned by the Knox County Land Bank for the express purpose of redevelopment particularly due to their current condition and proximity to Heartland Commerce Park (former Siemens manufacturing facility). Per the code there are four considerations with regard to this change.

(1) Compatibility of the amendment sought with the use of adjacent land, adjacent zoning and with land use plans for the general area.

The land immediately adjacent to these parcels is zoned PCDD, so this request is not spot zoning but an expansion of a zoning district to a contiguous parcel. Also, the plan for redevelopment is to add affordable senior housing. This residential use would align with the other adjacent properties becoming a bridge between the manufacturing and residential uses. This can help preserve the residential neighborhood feel.

(2) Impact of the adoption of an amendment sought on motor vehicle access and traffic flow in the general area.

The zoning change will not significantly impact motor vehicle access or traffic flow. The driveway and parking area will be connected to Burgess Street to the south and not add additional car traffic on neighboring properties along Norton Street.

(3) Impact of the adoption of the proposed amendment upon the public health, safety and general welfare of the residents of the city.

Local and regional housing studies have shown a significant demand for housing in Knox County and the region. This demand impacts residents of all income and age levels. Up till now, the housing development in Mount Vernon has mostly focused on market-rate housing that is attractive to young professionals and families. As the population of Knox County and Mount Vernon gets older, we need safe, age-in-place style housing. This type of housing will allow the seniors to be appropriately housed and allow them to live independently for longer. Additionally, the housing that those seniors live in now will become available for others and will most likely be more affordable than the new builds. Most importantly, this is not a housing project but a

living project. These units will be rent controlled, so they remain affordable for seniors on a fixed income, and the Area Agency on Aging (AAA5) will offer services to these seniors allowing them to stay in their homes. The yard and property maintenance will be handled by AAA5, meaning these homes will be cared for and be a value add to surrounding homeowners.

(4) Impact of the adoption of the proposed amendment on available public facilities, general expansion plans of the City, and the City's schedule for improvement of capital facilities.

This development will not impact the expansion of city services or facilities. In fact, creating homes of greater density will slow the need for urban sprawl. And with the residents being routinely checked in on by AAA5 and in units with age-in-place considerations such as grab bars, wider doorways, zero-point entryways, and cleared sidewalks, this will hopefully reduce the risk of falls and health concerns that are a strain on EMS services in the city.

A statement on the ways in which the proposed amendment relates to the comprehensive plan:

This zoning change and future development support the Knox County Comprehensive Plan (2018) in the following ways.

Chapter 3: Ensure responsible growth

Goal 3.3.3: Control scale and scope of development

"Encourage development in areas already on the grid." We are not extending the grid further by building affordable senior multi-unit housing on these parcels. This means the development cost for taxpayers is less because there will be more users paying into the system without the need for new infrastructure. Projects like this are outlined as a target outcome of the Knox County Land Bank (3.3.3A Outcome D).

Chapter 5: Strengthening quality of life

5.2 - This chapter highlights housing as a community issue and priority for the county to be successful.

Goal 5.3.1: Diversify the county's housing stock

"Affordability, changes in household size, an aging population, and a growing preference for walkability, will all continue to reshape Knox County's residential development patterns moving forward. An attractive, high-quality, and safe housing stock is important for retaining and attracting residents." This project aligns with this

goal because it provides safe, attractive, high-quality, and affordable housing for the aging population.

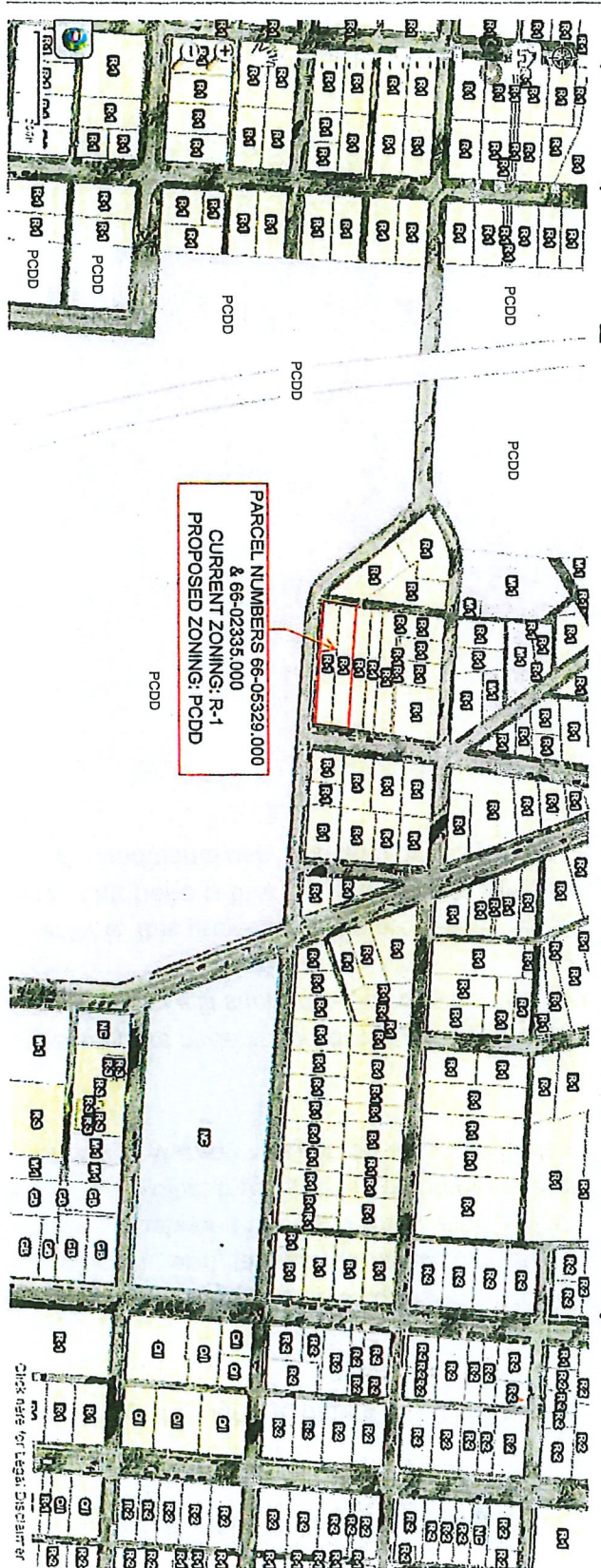
This zoning change is also supported through the Mount Vernon Strategic Plan (Phase 1, 2021) guiding principles.

Principle #1: *Foster a collaborative environment that is supportive of business and economic growth through fair, efficient, and transparent regulatory processes.*

This project is a collaboration between the Land Bank, AAA5, and the County Commissioners. By supporting this project through this zoning change and the following processes the City of Mount Vernon can join on as a collaborator for affordable senior housing.

Principle #6: *Through initiatives such as streamlined development processes, innovative zoning, and strategic incentives the City will support policies to ensure safe, abundant and attainable quality housing.*

This project speaks directly to this project and the processes we are currently undertaking to make it a reality. Our hope is that the City will use this principle when evaluating the project for zoning, conditional use, and final development plans.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Mount Vernon, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: That hourly pay rates are established for the following seasonal and part-time positions as follows:

SECTION 2: Part-time firefighters who work the holidays of New Year's Day, July 4th , Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve, and Christmas Day will be compensated at time and one-half

(1½) their normal rate of pay. Eligibility for this holiday pay will be calculated from 7:00 a.m. on the actual holiday through 7:00 a.m. on the following day.

SECTION 3: Any provision in legislation previously adopted which is in conflict with this Ordinance is repealed.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and for the further reason to set part-time and seasonal employees pay at competitive rates to allow the City to recruit and retain these employees, and said Ordinance shall, therefore, become effective upon its date of passage and approval by the Mayor, provided that it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to the Council of the City of Mount Vernon; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING COMPENSATION FOR THE ASSISTANT LAW DIRECTORS IN THE OFFICE OF THE LAW DIRECTOR; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Mount Vernon, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: That the following supervisory positions are hereby authorized within the salary range and upon the appropriation times listed below:

Assistant Director of Law I.....\$83,669.00
Assistant Director of Law II.....\$72,289.00

The salary authorized by this Ordinance shall be payable bi-weekly.

SECTION 2: The salaries listed are the base salaries for the positions. The positions are eligible for annual longevity increments:

For the first five (5) years, \$400.00.

Annual Longevity Increments after five (5) years:

Year 6	Year 7	Year 8	Year 9	Year 10
\$500.00	\$550.00	\$600.00	\$650.00	\$700.00

The effective date of eligibility for an annual longevity increment shall be the anniversary date of employment in that position.

SECTION 3: Exempt employees are expected to work as necessary, including outside of normal business hours, in the completion of their duties. Exempt employees will work with their supervisor in establishing their work schedule.

SECTION 4: These positions shall be entitled to the benefits outlined in Section E of the Mount Vernon Employee Handbook effective August 2021, as amended.

SECTION 5: All prior ordinances governing pay and benefits for the personnel listed in this ordinance are repealed.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and for the further reason to allow

the City to recruit and retain skilled professionals in the Office of the Law Director, become effective upon its date of passage and approval by the Mayor, provided that it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to the Council of the City of Mount Vernon; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
