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REMARKS FROM THE ADMINISTRATION

Police Chief Robert Morgan presented his department's quarterly report to Council, and answered several questions from Council Persons about personnel issues in the Police Department. Morgan also introduced the department's new Community Advocate, Dan Jackman. Mayor Matt Starr talked about the importance of Veterans Day.

REMARKS FROM COUNCIL

Francis asked Law Director Robert Broeren to draft legislation amending Codified Ordinance 753.04: Time Limit or Canvassing or Solicitation, to state that it's unlawful to canvass or solicit prior to 9:00 a.m. or after sunset Monday through Sunday or on a State or national holiday. Presently the ordinance states that such activity is unlawful prior to 9:00 a.m. or after 9:00 p.m. Monday through Sunday or on a State or national holiday. Francis also talked about the importance of Veterans Day. Woods noted that Help Wanted signs are not allowed in residential areas, and thanked Council Persons for open dialogue on Council. Seavolt thanked Lauren Heffelfinger, who spoke earlier during the Council meeting, for having representatives from the Fire Department speak to her class. Seavolt also welcomed newly elected Council Persons Josh Kirby and Mel Severns and the Police Department's new Community Advocate, Dan Jackman. Hillier thanked Police Officer Jessica Butler, who was recently injured while on duty, for her professionalism. He asked the Administration and Police Chief to coordinate with him to schedule a meeting on chronic nuisance properties. He also noted that the Holiday Parade will be downtown on Saturday, Nov. 27 at 3:30 p.m. Keener noted that Main Street Mount Vernon will have veterans banners on Main Street beginning Nov. 10, and that residents can register for the organization's upcoming Festival of Lights on its website. Hawkins noted "A Christmas Carol" will be staged at the Woodward Opera House on Dec. 3-5 to benefit the Winter Sanctuary homeless shelter.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY SERVICE DIRECTOR TO ENTER INTO CONTRACT FOR ADDITIONAL INTERIM RISK REDUCTION MEASURES AT THE KNOX CATTLE COMPANY DAM, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Mount Vernon is a party to litigation regarding the Knox Cattle Company Dam currently pending in the Knox County Court of Common Pleas; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to undertake certain Additional Interim Risk Reduction Measures (“IRRM”) to protect residents and property near the dam; and

WHEREAS, the City contemplates that the Knox County Court of Common Pleas will issue an order requiring the City to undertake the IRRMs. The order will require the City to be reimbursed for any costs expended for the IRRMs at the end of the litigation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Mount Vernon, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: Upon receipt of an order from the Knox County Court of Common Pleas requiring the City to undertake certain Additional Interim Risk Reduction Measures (“IRRM”) at the Knox Cattle Company Dam that the Safety Service Director for the City of Mount Vernon be authorized and directed to enter into contract for the IRRMs as directed by the order.

SECTION 2: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and for the further reason to enable the construction to commence as soon as possible, and said Resolution shall, therefore, become effective upon its date of passage and approval by the Mayor, provided that it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to the Council of the City of Mount Vernon; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DONATION OF REAL PROPERTY IN CLINTON TOWNSHIP (PARCEL # 12-50012.000) TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF KNOX COUNTY, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Constitution grants certain Home Rule powers to municipalities, including the ability to donate municipal property to another public body if the donation would constitute a public municipal purpose; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mount Vernon owns real property consisting of 63.32 acres on Thayer Road in Clinton Township, Knox County, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the City leased this real property to the Board of Commissioners of Knox County, Ohio, for a period of 30 years, which ends on December 31, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Mount Vernon, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: That the Council finds that the City of Mount Vernon owns the following real property that is no longer needed for public use:

Permanent Parcel number 12-50012.000 which contains 63.32 acres located on Thayer Road, Clinton Township, Knox County, Ohio, which is more fully described in Ex. A (attached).

Council also finds that the value of the real property is in excess of \$1,000.00.

SECTION 2: That the Council finds that donating this real property to another public body would constitute a public municipal purpose, and that the Board of Commissioners of Knox County, Ohio is a public body.

SECTION 3: That the Safety Service Director for the City of Mount Vernon be authorized and directed to transfer to the Board of Commissioners of Knox County, Ohio Permanent Parcel number 12-50012.000.

SECTION 4: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and for the further reason of transferring this real property before the expiration of the current lease, and said Resolution shall, therefore, become effective upon its date of passage and approval by the Mayor, provided that it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the

members elected to the Council of the City of Mount Vernon; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Being in the South Western part of Lot Number Seventeen (17), Quarter three (3), Township six (6), Range thirteen (13) being in Clinton Township, Knox County, Ohio and more particularly described as commencing at a post at the southwest corner of said lot seventeen (17) at a post and running thence South eighty-five degrees thirty minutes (85 deg. 30 min.) east one hundred six rods (106) to the middle of the Thayer Road, so called, witnessed by an elm thirty-six inches (36") in diameter bearing North seven degrees sixty-one and one-half feet (7 deg. 61 1/2 ft.) distance, thence North four degrees fifty minutes (4 deg. 50 min.) East thirty-eight and seventy-nine hundred rods (38.79) to a point in the middle of said Road thence North three degrees (3) East twenty (20) rods to a point in the middle of said road; thence North three degrees thirty minutes (3 deg. 30 min.) West twenty-nine and sixty-three hundreds (29.63) rods to a point in the middle of the said road; thence North ten degrees East twenty-six and thirty-six hundreds (26.36) rods to the intersection of the middle of said Thayer Road with the South line of the C. A. & C. SECTION 4: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and for the further reason that Revised Code Section 709.023(C) requires the City to act within 20 days of the filing of the annexation petition to state what municipal services it will provide to a parcel annexed through this process, therefore, it become effective upon its date of passage and approval by the Mayor, provided that it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to the Council of the City of Mount Vernon; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 1901.33, provides that the legislative authority of the municipality where a municipal court is located shall prescribe the compensation of Probation Officer;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Mount Vernon, Ohio that:

SECTION 1: That this Ordinance fixed the compensation and benefits of certain employees of the Mount Vernon Municipal Court, commencing on the 1st day of November, 2021 as follows:

Senior Probation Officer 1: **\$24.07** per hour (\$23.07 payable from the General Fund - Probation Officers & Clerk and \$1.00 payable from the Probation Services Fund)

SECTION 2: This position shall be entitled to the benefits as outlined in the Mount Vernon Municipal Court Employee Handbook, adopted January 1, 2015 and amended thereafter.

SECTION 3: That Ordinance 2021-07, Section 1, only that pertains to Probation Officer 1 and all of the preceding ordinances governing pay and benefits for this Municipal Court personnel as stated herein are repealed.
